

## MyCourse List: Homepage Portlet View




#### **Objective:**


- 1) the ability to order your courses within a list and
- 2) the ability to show/hide course titles
- 3) leave existing code and business rules for portlet untouched

#### Solution:

Add a Settings button in the titlebar of the Courses portlet. Clicking the button would bring the user to a focus view containing an interface to allow the user to drag and drop course titles and the ability to show/hide courses.




# MyCourse List: Settings Page Overview



#### Overview

The above interface is a prototype of the features the user would see after having clicked the "Settings" button.

# **MyCourse List:** Settings Page Features




- Course Title Behavior is identical to that in the Courses portlet except course would open in new browser window.
- Show/Hide Checkboxes allows user the choice to display or not to display a particular course in the courses portlet.
- Orag n' Drop Icon allows user to drag course titles up and down through the list. The order set here will mirror in the courses portlet.
- Existing Section Headers these exist today in Courses portlet. The user would not be able to drag n' drop these.

- Lock Icon this icon appears when an item is not draggable.
- Cancel Button allows user to exit Setting page without saving changes.
- Save Changes Button Saves all changes made on Setting page and returns user to CourseCompass homepage.
- Restore Defaults allows user to show all courses and to reset the ordering back to alphabetical.

### MyCourse List: Ordering Courses

#### To change the order of your course list:

The user would click and hold on the move icon or anywhere within that row, drag the course title up or down in the list to the desired location, then release the mouse. The user would then click the "Save Changes" button, and return to the CourseCompass homepage.

### MyCourse List: Show/Hide Courses

### Show/hide course listings:


If a user does not want a course title to display in the courses portlet without deleting that particular course, the show/hide check-boxes would allow them to do so.


To hide a course title from the course list, the user would uncheck the checkbox to the right of the course title in the "Show" column. The user would then click the "Save Changes" button to return to the CourseCompass homepage.

## **Announcements:** Homepage Portlet View






#### **Objective:**

- 1) make course announcements hidden as the default view
- give the user the ability to show or hide all course announcements.

#### Solution:


Add a Settings button in the titlebar of the Announcements portlet. Clicking the button would bring the user to a focus view containing an interface to allow the user to show/hide course announcements.



## **Announcements: Settings Page**

### **Announcements Settings:**

The user can show or hide all course announcements by selecting a radio button, then clicking the "Save Changes" button.

We will try to achieve the following:

add a settings button to the title bar of the courses and announcement portlets create a course list setting page allow users to drag a course title into position to order their list (see restrictions) allow users to hide courses in the courses portlet without deleting the course allow users to save these changes or cancel out of them allow users to perform all of the above from one location create an announcements setting page hide course announcements as the default view allow users to show/hide all course announcements
